- 1. Welcome and introductions. Nafisa explained Lynn was unable to attend today's meeting due to an urgent matter arising. Therefore, she was chairing this meeting.

A note on Marmot cities...

Marmot cities are part of an initiative aimed at reducing health inequalities by implementing eight key principles that focus on the social determinants of health. These principles emphasize the importance of creating fair opportunities for all residents to lead healthy lives, regardless of their socio-

economic status. The initiative encourages cities to collaborate with local communities and stake holders to develop tailored strategies that address specific health challenges.
